In a hybrid learning model, only 50% of classroom and bus capacity is used to provide maximum social distancing and students attend with a modified schedule.

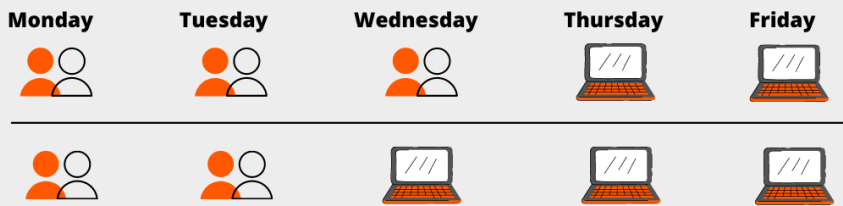

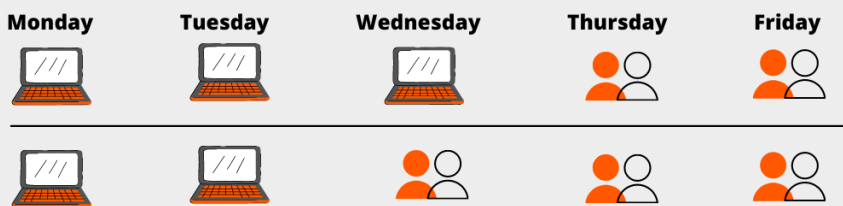

What does Hybrid Learning look like?

- School work is completed through an in-person and distance learning platforms on alternate (A or B) days.
- Students schedules limit the amount of students moving throughout the building during the day.
- Students attend school with a modified schedule.
- Family considerate model allows students in the same family to be on the same schedule.
- Strict social distancing requirements are enforced.
- Reduced class and bus sizes are in place.
